Uncertainty solely remains about the precise relationship between specific concentrations of particular greenhouse gases most importantly water vapour and carbon dioxide and changes in global temperatures. It is beyond doubt that certain gases in the atmosphere contribute to the so-called greenhouse effect by trapping heat. Human activity like burning carbon-based fuels, but also deforestation and ploughing is intensifying this effect and causing a constant rise in carbon dioxide concentrations. The growing empirical evidence for climate change triggered a global response, even though some authors classify it as meagre (Helm 2008). In 1992, 154 countries joined the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UN FCCC), to cooperatively consider what they could do in...



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
