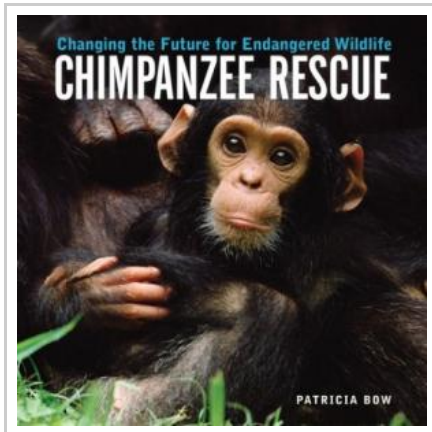




Chimpanzee Rescue: Changing the Future for Endangered Wildlife
